Organisation

Registered Charity

LTSU is a registered charity, democratically led by its student members through two annually elected Sabbatical Officers, the President and Vice- President.

These two roles are supported by a small staff team who are experts in their fields, together they can ensure the best experience at Leeds Trinity, for all students.



LTSU operates independently with its financial status and is funded by the University through a block grant of just over £314k.

This is supplemented by some additional funding for sports and activities.as well as self-generated income through our commercial outlets and events.

This takes our total revenue to around £471k. This enables us to deliver opportunities and services for students.





A Closer Look

Student Council

Every year, students are elected to over 200 roles across the Union, including the Student Council.

The Student Council provides the democratic, political leadership of the organisation and is responsible for representing the views of students.



Trustee Board

As a charity, we are led by nine trustees made up of two elected Sabbatical Officers, three student trustees, and up to four external trustees. They are the first and final decision- making body of the Union.

External trustees on the Board have a background in Mental Health, students studying to become teachers, Higher Education policy, and significant experience in campaigning and good practice within Students' Unions.

They are joined by three student trustees and the two sabbatical officers



Our Officers

Every year, LTSU holds an annual Election in which students can stand for a range of part-time (volunteer) roles, and two (paid) roles. Together, our Elected Officers represent the voices of Trinity students.

President

The highest Elected student officer and is ultimately in charge of the SU.

They are the figurehead of LTSU and are the key contact between the University and external organisation's such as the National Union of Students (NUS).

The President leads on academic matters, working closely with staff on the Course Reps and School Reps systems.

They chair the Board of Trustees; line manage the Chief Executive and are a Governor on the Board of Governors.

Vice-President

The Vice-President promotes and protect student communities at Leeds Trinity.

They work with the Advice Centre to ensure effective support and advice is provided.

They also work closely with the staff team on ensuring there is a wide range of societies and events.

The Vice President is a member of the Union Trustee Board, Student Council, and Student Executive Committee, and chairs the Student Activities Committee.

You will have an awareness of the day-to-day activities of the organisation and provide sound assistance to the Chief Executive through your role.

Time Commitment

The Board typically meet seven times a year usually on Thursday evenings from 6pm online. One of the meetings is an extended training weekend day within a comfortable distance from Horsforth. This is an unpaid voluntary role, but reasonable travel expenses will be reimbursed.



Eligibility

Leeds Trinity Students' Union is a charity registered with The Charity Commission, and must comply with Charity Law. There are requirements about who can, and cannot be a Trustee.

You are not allowed to be a trustee if you:

- Are under 18 years of age
- Are on the Sex Offenders' Register
- Have an unspent conviction (see below for details) for an offence involving deception or dishonesty
- Terrorist offences
- Money laundering
- Bribery
- Misconduct in public office, perjury, perverting the course of justice
- contravention of certain preventative Orders of the Charity Commission (s.77 of the Charities Act 2011)
- Attempting, aiding, or abetting these offences
- Have been found in contempt of court
- Are within designation under specific anti-terrorist legislation
- Have been found guilty by the High court of disobeying a Commission order or direction

Have been removed from:

- Trusteeship, or as an officer, agent, or employee of a charity by the Court or the Commission for misconduct or mismanagement
- A position of management or control of a charity in Scotland for mismanagement or misconduct
- Have been subject to a disqualification order under the Company Directors Disqualification Act 1986
- Have undergone undischarged bankruptcy
- Have a composition or arrangement with creditors which includes an individual voluntary arrangement (IVA), and is currently on the Insolvency Service Register
