### INTRODUCTION

#### Leeds Trinity Students' Union is a charity.

As a charity we exist for the benefit of Leeds Trinity students. We do this in five ways:

- 1. We act as a medium of communication between the members of the Union, the Governors, the University and other bodies.
- 2. We advance the education of our members and students of the University as a whole.
- 3. We represent the interest of our members and act as a channel of communication in dealing with the University and other bodies.
- 4. We promote and protect the welfare of our members through the provision of information, advice and activities.
- 5. We promote, encourage and co-ordinate student clubs, societies, sports and student activities.

#### How is the Union run?

The Union is led by two annual elected officers - the President and Vice-President. As a charity there are also nine trustees made up of two elected sabbatical officers, three student trustees and up to four external trustees. They are the first and final decision making body of the Union. Political and policy decisions are made by the annually elected Student Council which includes the President and Vice-President.

A small staff team support the work of the elected officers and the overall strategy that has been agreed by the Trustees.

Thank you to Leeds Trinity University for their continued professional and financial support. Also thank you to our sponsors Arrow Cars, Dominos, Endsleigh, Hemingways, PRYZM and Superbull. "As we go into the last year of our current strategy within the Big Plan we reflect with pride on our achievements over the past year.

Our Mental Health Leaders programme is now at full speed with over 50% of students having taken part. We also opened an on campus cashless convenience and clothing shop which scored a 92% satisfaction rating in our most recent annual Rate your Union survey.

We continued our commitment to the environment and sustainability achieving for the second year running the Green Impact accreditation. Our work was externally audited by the National Union of Students (NUS) through their Quality Students' Unions standard with us achieving the best possible score across a number of categories firmly placing us as a sector leading Students' Union. We have also presented on sector leading work in student commercial services and mental health.

Engagement with students continues to increase with us achieving a 39.5% election turnout in March 2019 which is the second highest turnout in the country. Our new ideas hub 'Students' Say' had 30 ideas submitted which included successfully lobbying the University to increase provision of lockers within the library and a microwave station being created for students to use. We also ran a range of events with the brilliant Student Council for Black History Month, World Mental Health Day, International Women's Day and LGBT History month.

Looking ahead we are delighted to be launching a new café and bar space StUdio on campus and will ensure students, as they are with everything we do, are at the heart of our service delivery. We launch a new website in Autumn 2019 which will offer our members enhanced access to information and funding for Sport Clubs and Societies. Additionally, we have a range of campaigns planned to ensure students have the best possible experience whilst at Leeds Trinity University, helping them gain experiences and opportunities like no other, it's our inclusive, personalised, student first approach that means our students will never feel as if they are not represented or left bored. Hosting our third annual Varsity this year against York St John also sparks excitement.



### **SOCIAL OPPORTUNITIES**


