Union Notes

- 1. The University does not have its own Marketplace yet, while other universities in the city do.
- 2. At the moment, sales between students happen in various Facebook groups, which are not always safe.
- 3. Without LTU Marketplace, students must spend money on postage, which is rather expensive, when sending a large book, due to its weight.

Union Believes

- 1. LTU Marketplace will greatly benefit students, as sales can happen on campus, rather than going to Headingly or Leeds City Centre.
- 2. No postal charges upon sale, which gives financial support to the seller.
- 3. No scams and dangerous transactions, as both parties are known to the university, as they will have to log into the system to be able to purchase or sell.
- 4. Current and Alumni students will be able to sell their books, notes, essential items for university, clothes, etc. giving back to the LTU community.
